

Horticulture



- Where measurements are given, height to be measured from base of container to apex of arrangement.
- Each exhibitor's items to be listed on one form. Junior entries on a separate form.
- Flowers, whether native or cultivated varieties, exhibited in cut-flower classes must have been grown by exhibitor.
- The stewards will subdivide classes for cut flowers should the number of entries make this desirable.
- All entries must be of horticultural materials. In arrangement sections, flowers need not be locally grown.
- Plants exhibited in container classes must have been in exhibitor's possession for at least 6 months.
- Plants of too large or awkward a shape to be safely handled may be rejected.

Definitions

Bloom: one flower displayed on a single stem.

Cut: two or more flowers / florets displayed on a single stem or a stem with secondary branches.

Bowl: a receptacle, the diameter of which is greater than its height.

Vase: a container, the height of which is greater than the diameter of its circular opening.

Container: a receptacle or holder of any shape or design, in which plant material is arranged.
